About the workshop

There is strong compelling evidence that classroom assessment practices can have a dramatic impact on student achievement. In schools where little benchmarking data is available, an effective classroom-based assessment program is even more critical. Through a series of interactive, practical activities participants will be introduced to several classroom-based assessment practices which are designed to use the assessment process to improve, rather than simply audit student learning. Participants will also explore where assessment fits in the bigger picture of curriculum, why so many schools worldwide are rethinking their assessment practices, and what 'science' is driving assessment practice. The practices we will explore include:

- * How to select the 'best' tool for every learning outcome
- * Using contextual assessments to assess what is most essential
- * Practical 'ongoing' assessment tools
